Among the community limitations boomers may contend with is lack of safe, reliable public transportation. Only half of survey respondents feel their community offers a high-quality public transportation service.

QUALITY OF LIFE



70% of respondents say the past year of their lives has been normal or better than normal, and more than 75% of seniors aged 60-69 expect their quality of life to stay the same or get better over the next five to 10 years.
